## From The Principal

Term 2 is up and running with lots of activities having already happened or on the agenda. Some of our annual items are outlined below, but we are also looking forward to Education Week and our Little Miss and Mr. Men dress up day celebrating 50 years of this iconic literary masterpiece. In addition, we have incursions and excursions planned, cyber safety sessions for students, staff and parents, not to mention all of the usual fun and excitement of our regular programs.

### The Resilience Project

Earlier this week parents were able to log in and enjoy a presentation from Hugh van Cuyler, founder of The Resilience Project. Hugh provided insight into the work that we are doing at school and in particular ran through the importance of gratitude, empathy and mindfulness. These areas underpin the work that we do with students each week as we look to build resilience and help our students look for the positives in life. Hugh discussed the natural human penchant for defaulting to the negative in our conversations and suggested that dinner times are the perfect opportunity to be device free and have a conversation with your children around the things that went well for them today. As I write this I am looking back on what went well for me on Tuesday. I completed (with a lot of help from students, parents and teachers) the pre-review self-evaluation report, my under 16 boys' basketball team put in a really strong training session and I led another school tour for prospective parents that was extremely positive. I would strongly encourage families to touch base with your children and ask them what went well today, instead of "what happened at school today". To be sure, if something negative happened and we need to know about it, I'm only a phone call away, but we are trying to build our students' mindsets to recognise all of the positive things that happen in our daily lives. This in turn will make them happier and help them to build resilience in order to better deal with the challenges that life will throw their way.

### Enrolments

Speaking of school tours, we are only a handful of enrolment applications shy of our 2022 target, with multiple fully booked school tours to come. Based on current projections, we are likely to have close to double the amount of applications as we have places. As a result of now being at capacity, unfortunately this means that not all prospective enrolments will be granted a place for next year. In order to assist the school in the enrolment process, can I please remind families that if you have a child who is ready to begin school in 2022, that you complete and submit an enrolment form as soon as possible, but by no later than Thursday June 24<sup>th</sup>. This will enable Christine and I to sort through and prioritise families inside our catchment and siblings of current students, before allocating places to others from outside our area, depending on capacity. **Please note, MPS cannot guarantee a place for an out of zone sibling if we receive the enrolment form after places have been offered.** As you can imagine, this is a huge task and your cooperation and understanding will be most appreciated.

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### Mulgrave Farmers Market

As families are no doubt aware, this Sunday sees MPS officially commence as the home of the Mulgrave Farmers Market. The market will operate from 8am – 1pm every Sunday and over its fourteen-year history, the Mulgrave Farmers Market has created an incredible social community and vibrant atmosphere for local residents, in addition to providing an outlet for farmers and artisans to sell their produce. Entry will be by gold coin donation, with all donations going to support the school.



### Uniform Update

Families are now able to purchase their uniforms online and from next week, in store via PSW's new outlet in Glen Waverley (behind Officeworks). I would like to thank the school community for their patience over the last few months as we transitioned from our old supplier. From here on, we hope that things will run a lot smoother and there will no longer be any hold-ups or delays in the supply chain. As mentioned previously, the school will extend a grace period throughout this term for families to update their uniform, with a view to school uniform being enforced in Term 3.

### Running Track Update

The concrete for the new running track was poured over the holidays and the clear outline of our Map of Australia is finally completed after 35 years at our current site. In late May, we anticipate the rubber will be poured to complete the northern coastline. The rubber will be predominantly ocean blue, with speckles of Uluru orange and desert sand thrown in to complete the mix. Finally, the wedge between the track and the hardcourts will be completed in green and gold and we are hopeful of being able to include the iconic 'Boxing Kangaroo' in this section, a symbol of Australian persistence and determination.

### Student Opinion Survey

This term students from Year 4 – 6 will complete the annual Attitudes to School Survey. The survey assists schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school during the two weeks of Monday, May 17th - Friday, May 28th. The survey only takes 20 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time.

The survey results will be reported back to the school as they are made available.

## NAPLAN Testing

The next round of the annual National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests will be conducted in May 2021. The NAPLAN tests will involve all students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 from all states and territories across Government, Catholic and Independent Schools. The NAPLAN tests will be conducted on Tuesday May 11, Wednesday May 12 and Thursday May 13.

NAPLAN assesses skills in Literacy and Numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how students are progressing in Numeracy and Literacy skills against national standards for all Australia children. It also provides valuable information that allows schools and governments to better target effort and support to help all students achieve their potential and acquire the basic skills to help them build successful and happy lives.

All students (in Years 3 & 5) are expected to participate in these tests. Students with disability may qualify for reasonable adjustments that reflect the support normally provided to them in the classroom. Some students with very specific circumstances may be exempted from participating in the tests. NAPLAN tests fundamental skills rather than specific content, and as such is not a test for which students can study or drill. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that **NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day.**

I strongly encourage all families to support their child in completing these assessments. They do not need to be daunting, they are just another test in a long line of tests that students undertake throughout their education, however the data from the NAPLAN tests can provide the school with important information about each child's point of need and any gaps in their learning. Yes, it also provides a snapshot of where we are at as a school, which we then use to refine our whole school approaches. We appreciate the participation of your child and encourage families to ensure that students are at school for all NAPLAN tests and importantly, **are well rested and have enjoyed a good breakfast!**

An individual student NAPLAN report will be issued by the school later this year. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern. ## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from [www.education.vic.gov.au/csef](http://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef)

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.





# Sharing your interests with your children

The family was a little shocked when dad Chris, bought his six and four-year-old daughters a motorbike. "You got them a what?" was the standard reply.

It turns out that getting his daughters a motorbike was a stroke of pure fathering genius, although Chris didn't know it at the time.

Chris bought the motorbike for his daughters because he had fond memories of riding on his family's farm when he was young. He wanted his kids to enjoy the same experience.

Close family members questioned Chris about introducing a motorbike to kids at such a young age, but he let it pass. He even received a comment or two about the suitability of such a pursuit for girls. "You and your brothers loved motorbikes, but that doesn't mean that your daughters will," was the attitude of some people. Undeterred, Chris spent many weekends riding in a nearby property teaching his girls the finer points of motorbike riding. He began by riding with each daughter using trainer wheels, slowly progressing to two wheeled riding as they grew more confident.



## THE PARENTING GENIUS IN THREE PARTS

### Helping them to face their fears

Firstly, after acknowledging his daughters' fears, Chris encouraged them to face them, but in their own time. The girls set the developmental pace, so they felt they had full control over their experiences. He showed himself to be astute listener ready to work with his daughters. This is respectful relationships in action.

### Lessons of self-worth

Secondly, through the experience Chris showed his daughters that what they do with their bodies is far more important than how they look. His daughters are young, and their attitudes may change when they become tweens or teens, but the lessons of self-worth they absorb during this stage of childhood are lasting. The fact that these messages come while sharing activities organised by their father adds to their potency.

### Communicating and forming strong bonds

Thirdly, he's using activity to communicate with and form strong bonds with his girls. Fathers generally express themselves best with their children when they are fully absorbed in an activity. Parenting author Steve Biddulph says 'activity is the language of fathering'. Men are usually at their parenting best when they're involved in games, having fun or being active with their kids. It is through activity that many dads teach kids lessons such as fairness, playing by the rules, trying their best and, of course, sharing stories from their own childhood.

Another side to this parenting genius is that Chris shared something of himself with his daughters when he bought that motorbike. Each time he rides with them he is sharing a part of who he is with his daughters – not the work persona, the parent persona or the friend persona – but something that is close to the essence of who is, which was forged during the joyous times of childhood.


