From The Principal

Dear parents and Carers,

Following the Acting Premier's announcement this morning regarding a snap Stage 4 lockdown from 11:59pm tonight, there will be no classes at Mulgrave Primary School from Friday May 28 to Thursday June 3, 2021.

Today your child will bring home various books and their logins for their online resources to allow them to access their learning throughout the next week.

Please note that a skeleton staff will be onsite on these days to cater for a very small number of students whose parents are essential workers. The vast majority of students will be at home. If you are an essential worker and are required to attend work at a site other than your home during school hours you may complete the online form:

If you believe you are an essential worker, please complete and submit the Onsite Supervision application by 4.30pm today so I can make staffing arrangements for tomorrow.

For supervision next week can the Onsite Supervision application please be completed by 5:00pm Friday to allow for appropriate staffing measures to be arranged.

Please note that all submissions need prior approval and you will receive an approval via email regarding confirmation or otherwise.

Students who are provided with permission to attend must be signed in and out by a parent for each day of attendance. Students must wear school uniform and bring their normal items to school each day.

In the interim, thank you everyone for adhering to the details above and for remaining abreast of these important notices. I will forward more information when and if it comes to hand. For this reason, there is no need to ring the school office for updates, particularly as our review will continue for much of today.

We have been here before and I understand that for many families this news has brought back memories of last year's lockdowns, and in some cases, negative memories. It is important to remember that your child's welfare and your own welfare is most important at this time and that the school is here to support you at this time.

School Review – Parent Forum 9am June 1st (to be confirmed due to Covid)

Today we commenced our four yearly school review. The review panel will meet over three days to examine the school's data, reflect on feedback provided by students, parents and staff, observe the consistency of our practice and help us set our goals for the next four years. As part of the review, all parents are invited to a morning forum with our school review panel on Tuesday June 1st, commencing just after 9am and running for 45 minutes. Should you wish to take part in the forum, please contact Christine at the office to book your place before 4pm Monday. A limit of 75 attendees will be in place due to Covid restrictions and masks will need to be worn at all times when indoors. The forum will be held in the old hall.

Following the completion of the review, the findings will be presented to school council and the next 4 year Strategic Plan will be developed. Once finalized, the Strategic Plan will be shared with the school community and subsequent to this, will be delivered via our Annual Implementation Plans which are published each year.

Reading, Sleeping, Eating

As per my recent newsletters, I would like to remind all families that all students are required to read every day as the core component of their homework. In general, texts are sent home that are approximately 2 levels below each student's instructional level, to ensure that home reading is not a chore and is enjoyable for both student and parent. The volume of words is the critical aspect and the more you read, the closer you are to better life outcomes. Establishing a bedtime routine that includes 30 minutes of reading not only helps students to disconnect from devices, it helps their brains clam down ready for a good night's sleep. We know from a massive amount of studies that students perform better when they get a good night's sleep and reading can be a way to bring this on. Our recent cyber safety sessions were unequivocal regarding the number of students who are pulling the wool over their parents eyes and using a device after 10:30pm. No primary school student should be up that late on a regular basis, as they need at least 11 hours sleep. Ensuring an early bedtime routine, complete with 30 minutes of reading, allows students to be able to wake up a little earlier and enjoy a healthy breakfast. Again, studies show that students who come to school hungry do far worse than their well fed peers.

The research is as clear as crystal. A student who reads, goes to bed before 10pm and has a good breakfast has established all the preconditions to ensure success at school.

Education Week

Although Education Week is this week, due to our school review, we enjoyed a variety of activities to mark the occasion last week instead, which as it turns out, could not have been timed better! The Mr. Men and Little Miss book character parade was a great success and it was so nice to have families on site for a whole school event again. Fortunately the weather was extremely kind to us, providing a glorious morning for the parade and there were lots of wonderful costumes and smiles all round. In addition, we held our Open Afternoon last Thursday. The timeslot was somewhat of a compromise, however it allowed families to enjoy visiting the new stadium as well as classroom, without inconveniencing our regular hirers. Again it was great to see our students and families enjoying the school facilities together. We have come such a long way in recent years and to be able to showcase it all is truly an honour for us at MPS.

Of course, the theme of Education Week is 'Building Connections', something we have been working very hard on despite the challenges of Covid last year. A particular focus has been improving home school communication via Xuno and Dojo, but significantly, we want to build the connections with our students and hear more of what they want out of their schooling (whilst acknowledging the realities of the curriculum of course). These areas, along with building connections to the broader community through the Farmers Market, shared use of our facilities and our new connection with Cumberland View Aged Care Living, will provide our students with greater resources and stronger connections with our local community. Of course, one of the big drivers of community connections is our wonderful PFA and I would like to thank all of the volunteers for organising the sausage sizzle for the Open Afternoon and for the enormous amount of work they do around the school.

Allergies and Intolerances

MPS is not a nut or fragrance free school, as research tells us that this can actually provide a false sense of security for those with anaphylaxis in particular. With this in mind, I'd also like to remind the community that many of our students are anaphylactic and others suffer from an intolerance to fragrances which manifests itself in the form of nausea and headaches. We would ask that all families are mindful of these conditions and are cautious when preparing food for student lunches and consider making reasonable adjustments in regards to fragrances when entering school buildings prior to school. Of particular concern is the chemical reactions that occur whilst people are wearing fragrances that create these intolerances. Whilst the school is not seeking to put in place a school wide ban in either case, your assistance and cooperation will help us to ensure the learning spaces are as safe for our students as possible.



Late Arrivals

When a student arrives after the 9.00am bell, they need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian (16 years or older) to the office first, where the student is signed in on Xuno and issued with a late arrival slip. The student then gives this slip to the class teacher and their attendance will then be changed from "absent" to "late arrival". Parents are still welcome to walk their child to the classroom in this instance, but must remain outside the room at all times.

Attitudes to School Survey

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and recently we have conducted a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school.

The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey for Levels 4 to 6, offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist us to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Participating students were asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, bullying and life in general.

Participating students were also asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their resilience, community connections and physical activity.

Participating students were provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used by the Department to combine data for research purposes only. Students' privacy and the confidentiality of their survey responses will be protected at all times. No identifiable personal data is included in the survey response file.

The survey results will be reported back to the school in Term 3. No student can be identified in the results reported to schools or in any other report of the data, however we appreciate the feedback offered by our students and look forward to building upon that.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
