The 2022 NAPLAN results are in and there are many positives for our students. Reading remains the key focus for MPS, with 100% of Year 3 students and 91% of Year 5 students at or above the National Minimum Standard (excluding students who are exempt). Of those students, a whopping 70% of Year 3's were assessed to be working in or above the top two NAPLAN bands. Results were similar for numeracy, with 98% of Year 3's and 94% of Year 5's at or above the standard. Another boost for the Year 3's, as they have absolutely dominated writing, with 73% of our students achieving results in the top 2 bands. This is 21% higher than the state average and 11% higher than schools with a similar socio-economic profile to ours!!! Unfortunately we do not have any growth data to share this year, as the Year 5's did not do the NAPLAN in 2020 due to the pandemic.

Next term, our staff will break down the data, look at areas where we didn't achieve the exceptional results that we expect and then reflect on our practice to ensure we continue to improve. Our goal remains to help our students achieve the best possible learning outcomes through consistency of practice and continuous improvement in how we teach every child. As with all things, Covid has brought inconsistency and there is no doubt that we have seen this in the 2021 NAPLAN results, with some areas not quite as high as we would like, but rest assured the results overall remain positive.

In the meantime, I would remind all students and families that reading is the key to a great education. Reading every day, be that before bed or for some down time, makes an enormous difference to student outcomes. Reading doesn't need to occur in large blocks, 5 minutes three times a day can be the difference between a good result and a great result. Of course, as I've stated before, we know that research tells us that if a child reads for over an hour a day, on average they achieve in the 98th percentile. Reward for effort!

Finally, I would remind all families of children who are receiving their results, to consider the positives of your child's achievements first and foremost. It is a snapshot in time and it has been well publicised that Covid was likely to have had a major impact.

Remote Learning

As of next week, teachers will be scaling back our remote learning platform. There will still be resources available, however the fuller planning documentation will no longer be updated weekly. This has been a significant additional load on our teaching staff and I thank them for their efforts. Should your child be away for a prolonged period of time, please liaise directly with their classroom teachers for support.

Step Into Prep

The Step Into Prep transition program commences next term. We look forward to welcoming our newest students into the school to help them settle into their new surroundings.

The following dates are set, with each session running from 9.15 to 10.00 am: Wednesday 19th October Wednesday 26th October Wednesday 9th November Wednesday 16th November

Parent Information night is **Wednesday 30th November**, **6.30** – **7.30pm**. Families will be informed of their child's 2023 class and teacher at this time. In addition, families will be provided an overview of what their child can expect next year and tips as to how to prepare your child for the year ahead.

3/4 Covered Outdoor Learning Area

Over the holidays, we expect to see our new COLA constructed outside 3/4M & 3/4L. This new learning space will enable the middle school students to be able to work outdoors on various tasks, making the most of the warmer months ahead. The covered space will be just over 80 square metres and will compliment the existing 5/6 COLA, PE covered space and the shaded quiet area outside 3/4S. Most of the project has been pre-fabricated, so it should only take a few days to put the pieces together. I'm sure the 3/4 students will make the most of it next term.

2024 Enrolments

As previously mentioned, the school is now at capacity and has commenced capping future enrolments at 66 from this year onwards. Having finalised 2023 enrolments, we are now in a position to begin accepting 2024 prep enrolments. Like this year, families of in-zone and sibling claims will be notified of a confirmed place as soon as we can process them, whilst out of zone applications will be confirmed in Term 3 2023. It would be extremely helpful if current families could send in their enrolment applications for siblings as soon as possible, so that we can better identify how many spaces we have available for new families.

Year 3 & 4 Camp

As we look forward to next week's camp, I would like to wish students and staff alike a safe, challenging and enjoyable 3 days at Oasis. After all of the challenges of the last two years or so, it will be great to see our kids step out of their comfort zones and experience a different perspective. The camp will allow students to discover new strengths and interests and perhaps even see each other in a different light. Camps are often a time where new friendships are made and confidence is built and I hope that this is true for all of our students next week.

Year 5 & 6 Camp

Whilst still a while away, November will be here before we know it. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions regarding the camp.

The end of term is upon us. A reminder that students will be **dismissed at 2:30pm on Friday September 16**th. It would be appreciated if parents could make appropriate arrangements for the collection of their children. For parents who cannot attend by 2:30pm, please make arrangements with Camp Australia for the supervision of your children.

Finally, I received some feedback recently where it was noted that I had not been outside in the afternoons as often as usual. I acknowledge that this has certainly been the case this winter. For the most part it has been on the basis of doctor's orders, following surgery in late term 1 and then Covid/Bronchitis earlier this term. Rest assured though, my door is always open for any parent or student who would like to chat and as the weather warms up, I'm sure you will be seeing more of me come the end of the day.

In the meantime, enjoy the down time should you be lucky enough to be having a break yourselves. Feel free to visit the school and use our facilities over the holidays and if you do notice any suspicious activity, please call 000.

Ali's Corner - Parents Spot



Giving kids social scripts

Recently, I heard my adult daughter rebuke a male friend who told her that she'd lost weight.

"You just can't say that," remarked my daughter.

Realising his mistake this young man said, "Okay. Sorry. What should I say instead?"

"Tell me I look healthy."

Values:

"Hey, you look really healthy!"

"That's better," remarked my daughter, who has clearly inherited an assertiveness gene from her mother.

This young man was well intentioned but his scripting was askew. He knew that a male complimenting a female about losing weight maybe no compliment at all, however he didn't know what else to say. My daughter gave him a new script, which he can use in similar situations in the future.

This scenario is relevant to parenting. At Parenting Ideas we always encourage parents to look for opportunities to give their kids social scripts so they can express themselves appropriately and effectively in different situations.

Benefits of social scripting for kids

Social scripting achieves the parenting trifecta. Giving kids scripts can help them stay safe, become social and importantly, become independent.

The job of parents is to wean kids off them, and social scripting is a big part of this process. Here are some ideas to get you started:

1. Asking a teacher for help or assistance

Motivated

Kids often coerce parents to do their bidding with teachers, coaches, siblings and other adults. It's easy to pick up the phone and arrange to meet a teacher or go into your child's room and ask for something on behalf of your child. Take a different approach.

"Choose a time when your teacher is free, and then ask her if you can sit at the front of the classroom. You could say...."

- 2. **Entering a game at school** Many kids struggle to enter into a game or activity at school, so they sit on the sidelines and miss out. Social scripting involves timing, not just the words to use. Consider coaching a child about how he or she may approach a situation. Suggest that he or she looks for someone they know, and waits for a lull in the game before asking.
- 3. **Telling a sibling to stop annoying them** "Jessica, please stop flicking the ruler while I'm watching TV. I find it annoying." This may work. If not, this child could try, "Jessica, could you flick your ruler elsewhere." It may work. It may not. But it's infinitely better than yelling, "Jessica, DOOOONNNN'TTTT!!!!" Give kids the scripts they need to help them negotiate their <u>sibling relationships</u>.
- 4. **Saying no to a friend without losing face** Research shows that many teenagers struggle with peer pressure because they don't know how to say no in a way that maintains their status. One strategy is to use an excuse rather than say give an outright no. "I don't want to drink tonight because I've got football training in the morning."
- 5. **Expressing their emotions** Both genders can struggle to <u>express their feelings</u>, particularly if they haven't been taught the words to use at home. Recently, I saw a mother prompt her three year old when he was clearly annoyed. "Are you frustrated Maxie?" "Yes, I fusttated!!" "Would you like a hug? "Yessss!"

You're never too young or too old to be hugged. Just as you're never too young or too old to receive a social script from a well-meaning friend or parent.

I believe our wonderful Dads had a great time on Sunday with their loved ones and liked the present they made with great enthusiasm and gratitude!





WHERE DO WE PLAY?

The Mulgrave Mambas Basketball Club compete in the Saturday competition of the Melbourne East Basketball Association (MBEA). This Saturday competition is known as the Greater Eastern Basketball Conference (GEBC). The MEBA/GEBC play games out of numerous venues in Melbourne's Eastern and South Eastern suburbs including: Nunawading Basketball Centre, The Rings, Forest Hill College, Mullauna Secondary College, The Knox School, Mulgrave Primary and Wheelers Hill Secondary College

WHAT ARE THE SEASON DATES?

The Summer '22/23 season is played across Term 4 ('22) and Term 1 ('23) commencing on Saturday 8th October and plays through until early April. The competition doesn't play on the Saturday of Melbourne Cup Weekend and takes a break for the Dec/Jan school holidays.

WHAT DOES IT COST?

The Player Registration fee for the Summer '22/23 season has been set at \$75 per player. Given we are a start up club we have subsidised this fee as much as possible. The Player Registration fee covers operational costs for the club/teams including Competition

Entry, Training Courts, Coach Polo's, Team Equipment, Trophies etc.

In addition to the Club Registration Fee, Basketball Victoria require all players to be registered and covered by insurance. This fee of \$26 covers players for 365 days from registration.

Finally, each team is required to pay a weekly "Team Sheet Fee" (\$84) to the competition that covers competition, court and referee costs. This fee for Summer '22/23 is set at \$195 per player and will be collected over 3 instalments of \$65 on 01/10/22, 01/12/22 and 01/02/23.

WHAT TIMES ARE GAMES?

The MEBA/GEBC Saturday competition start games at 8am with the last game concluding by 7:15pm.

Games are (in most cases) allocated in "blocks" by age group with Under 8's/10's starting the day from 8am through to Under 18's playing the later timeslots.

TRAINING

Training will be held at Mulgrave Primary School after school once per week during the season.

Specific days/times of trainings will be determined closer to the season in c onsultation with the team coaches.

UNIFORMS

Once we have closed registrations we will be holding a uniform "try on" day for all players to order their uniforms.

As the foundation players of the Mulgrave Mambas all playing uniforms for the inaugural season will be provided free of charge to players.

This will include a reversible playing singlet and shorts.

Given the time frame from try-on day to ordering we won't have the uniforms in time for the 8th October so we have ordered reversible navy/white singlets in the interim

These will be handed out at the first training next Term.

For these initial weeks, we ask that players wear black basketball shorts (no pockets allowed).


