Message From The Principal

This year has been our first full year of schooling in some time and as such, we can see the students beginning to fatigue. I'm sure as parents we can also feel the effects of the previous few years and the toll that Covid has taken. Teachers are very mindful of this and are doing their best to be supportive, but it is in the yard that we most often see issues bubble over. We regularly discuss with our students the importance of regulating their responses and the strategies they can use to help them. If you notice your child is "hitting the wall", ask them about their Zones of Regulation. They should be able to tell you some of the strategies that we discuss to help them get back to the green zone where they are happy, calm and focused on their learning. Some of these strategies might be as simple as taking a few deep breaths or counting to ten before reacting to something that has upset them, but most importantly, if your child feels like they are no longer in control, ask them to try to remember to find a teacher or a supportive friend. As you read this, we have only 23 more school days until the end of the year. Hopefully the weather will start to be a little kinder to us and we can enjoy the big events remaining in the year, which will hopefully spread a little more joy and enthusiasm to help us power through.

Community Engagement - Changes to Parents On Site

At our School Council meeting earlier in the week, we discussed the current arrangements for parents coming on site first thing in the morning. The time has come to revert back to pre-Covid conditions and effective immediately, parents are welcome to bring their children into the school grounds from 8:45am. With this in mind, there are a number of caveats:

- 1. Teachers are not available for impromptu meetings before school. If you need to speak with your child's teacher, we expect that families will continue to make an appointment. It is simply not fair to doorstop a teacher at 8:57am when their focus is on starting the school day for all children in their class.
- 2. We request that parents let their children enter their respective buildings independently. All of our students have proven how independent they can be. We do not want them to regress because a parent is hanging their bag on their hooks or carrying their lunchbox into the classroom. They are quite capable of doing this by themselves. Parents should farewell their child/ren as they move to the line up area.
- **3.** Respect the Kiss and Go drop off zone at the front of the school. Parking restrictions are a Monash Council matter and this will not change. Parents cannot leave their car unattended to enter the school grounds. This may incur a fine if inspectors are in the area. If you choose to use this parking area, you must move your vehicle within 5 minutes. This also applies after school. Additional parking is available at Gladeswood Reserve.

We look forward to parents mingling on site again and building deeper family and school connections. We would like to thank families for their strong support of the previous model. It has shown just how independent our students can be and it has led to a settled start to the school day. Where possible, we do encourage families to continue this practice, but by the same token, we respect the importance of families coming together at school.

2023 Parent Contributions

Soon parents will be receiving the 2023 Parent Contribution letter. The letter will outline what I feel is incredible value provided by MPS. For less than \$10 a week we take the hassle out of securing stationery and books, resources for art, PE, music, STEM and Spanish, not to mention the variety of digital learning tools that we can source at a significantly discounted rate. Some of these items, if purchased privately, would be upwards of 5 times the cost. Under the new rules, schools are required to provide a basic education for free. Of course, the fine print is that this really entitles a student of a pencil and a piece of paper to work on (it's not that basic, but you get the idea). Unfortunately, schools did not receive increased funding to offset the changes and it leads to shortfalls in the essential items required to provide a quality education

We appreciate that sometimes finding the money to pay school fees can be difficult, which is why we are always open to a private conversation if need be. As such, we always do our best to keep our costs low, but as is the way of the world at the moment, costs of supplies are rising. What we have done is reduce the number of items required in the booklist by using existing stock wherever possible, but this can only last so long.

In the end, I strongly urge parents to support the school through making the voluntary contribution. In addition, with future building works likely in the not too distant future, you may wish to consider a donation as well. Without your support, the ongoing improvements we aim to make take a little longer or may be a little scaled down. In 2023 we are seeking to redo some of our line markings and introduce new play markings (e.g. snakes and ladders), replace the courtyard seating, install a covered way to the 5/6 portables and renovate the old library, just to name a few projects. With your continued support, we can continue to make our school the heart of the Mulgrave community and the best that it can be.

2022 State Election

Unfortunately, we have not had enough volunteers to run a BBQ on election day. Whilst it's always nice to draw a crowd of voters, we recognise that with more and more pre-polling, less and less people are attending on the day, leading to lower revenues from such fundraising.

My thanks to those who volunteered nevertheless. Of course, as the parents of MPS head to the ballot box, we are in the fortunate position where both major parties have made a significant commitment to developing our school. We look forward to working with the elected government to make those commitments a reality by creating a new STEM centre and library, as well as a new entry and turning circle at the tennis club corner of the school.

Late Arrivals and Uniforms

As mentioned in my last newsletter piece, lateness continues to be an issue. On Tuesday morning our foyer was full of students who needed to sign in. Myself and Viki helped them use the tablet to speed up the process, however the point remains that students simply need to be at school a few minutes earlier. I urge all families to aim to be at school by 8:55am, so that your child can comfortably make it to the line up area and make their way in to class at 8:57am, ready to learn at 9am sharp. In addition, students are being seen more and more in the incorrect uniform. The uniform list is available on the website and we would ask that families respect the school rules in this area and purchase the appropriate items. If your child cannot wear a uniform item on a particular day, a note explaining this would be appreciated. For most students though, the school provides a wide range of uniform options which can easily be purchased via PSW in Glen Waverley.

Staffing and the 2022/3 Transition Program

The school is finalising staffing arrangements for 2023. As parents would be aware, we are in the midst of a teacher shortage and this also creates opportunity for some of our current staff. In 2023, Ms Melnyk, Miss Eden, Mr Louey and Mrs Stephanou will all be taking up roles in new schools. In addition, Miss Hickleton and Miss Pope will be taking 12 months leave to pursue their travel interests. This has meant that we have had to undertake significant recruiting this year, which remains ongoing as you read this. In our next newsletter I hope to be able to publish our full staff list for 2023, which will be soon after your child meets their new teacher for the first time on Nov 29th. The transition program will run over three weeks, where your child can get to know their new classmates and teacher ahead of the school holidays, meaning they will be ready to hit the ground running at the start of the new school year.

Families Moving On

If your child/ren are planning a move and will not be returning to MPS in 2023, can you please advise the office as soon as possible as we finalise grade lists and budgets for 2023.

Finally, best wishes for our Year 5 & 6 campers as they head off next Monday. For the Year 6's I hope it is the start of a wonderful conclusion to your time at MPS and for the Year 5's, I hope it is a time where you can see your classmates in new and positive ways that sets up a brilliant final year of primary school.

Thunderstorm Asthma and Hayfeveri

Dear Parents

As we finally move into the warmer weather, the risk of Thunderstorm Asthma and severe Hayfever symptoms increases.

Thunderstorm asthma can happen suddenly to people in spring or summer when there is a lot of pollen in the air and the weather is hot, dry, windy and stormy.

High amounts of pollen, especially during windy days can get stuck in eyelashes cause ongoing irritation for Hayfever suffers.

Below are some strategies for preventing and managing symptoms

- Alert the school by email if your child is at risk of severe symptoms.
- Be aware of high pollen days using a weather app.
- Ensure that your child has taken an antihistamine that morning. Speak to your Pharmacist about the most appropriate antihistamine as needs can sometimes change.
- Encourage your child to remember their Preventer inhaler (Flixotide) if appropriate and prescribed by a Medical Practitioner.

A reminder that medication cannot be left with the student. All medication must be presented to the office where a **Medication Authority Form can be filled out by a parent or guardian.


What are your children really fighting about?


