#### **Message From The Principal**

Another massive year is coming to a close. It has been a long year in so far as it is the first full year back at school after two years of on again/off again remote learning. I think it's fair to say that all of us have had our "match fitness" tested as the year has progressed, but our students have remained focused and have achieved some great results along the way. It has been so nice to be able to reintroduce all of our usual activities and we hope that that continues to grow next year.

#### Carols

As I write this it is bucketing down outside. It is likely that we will have to move our Carols evening into the stadium. Classes have been busily practising their songs for the night and we look forward to a wonderful evening, so we will find a way! This year, we will be selling drinks and icypoles, however there will not be a BBQ, so please consider bringing a picnic feed for the evening. If we are in the stadium, I would ask families to be mindful of the floor, as it will still be used for basketball competition the following weekend.

#### Graduation

Last Monday saw our 2022 Year 6 students celebrate their Graduation. It was a wonderful evening and I would like to thank all of our parent volunteers for their efforts, as well as Mrs. Turner, Mr. Giles and Mr. Geer for their work in organising a sensational event. It is always a great time for families to share their child's achievements and Monday was no different, with our Year 6's doing themselves proud. Lots of smiles, more than a few tears and a great night had by all.

#### Uniforms in 2023

All students are required to attend in school uniform and whilst the end of the year often sees families "stretching the life out of items" or using nonuniform clothing, we would remind families that full uniform is required for the start of the new school year.

Whilst it may seem trivial, signing up to attend MPS includes agreeing to uphold our uniform standards. As we move into 2023 the only uniform that is acceptable to wear each day is listed on the PSW website, with the exception of shoes where we recognise the importance of choosing the appropriate active footwear for your child's growing feet. I strongly urge all families to follow up on school uniform over the summer break, including the school bag. Having a consistent uniform is a mark of respect and also an important aspect of student discipline and behavioural standards. It also becomes an important visual aid for when we leave the school grounds and are representing the school in the broader community. In the end, it says I attend Mulgrave Primary School and builds pride in our school community.

#### Social Media and Age Appropriate Viewing Habits

Recently we have seen a growing number of students referring to Netflix, Tik Tok and other platforms in relation to content that is well beyond their capacity for understanding. Children move through developmental stages where their brains become better equipped to interpret themes in the broader world. The Australian rating system is based on these milestones and are a good guide for what your children should be exposed to. We have heard students discussing plot details of shows designed for adults. Some of these themes are particularly violent and simply not fit for our younger students, as it can leave them with disturbing images that they do not have the capacity to process. With the holidays approaching and screen time on the rise, your cooperation in ensuring your child is viewing and discussing appropriate content is appreciated.

#### Reading

I know I say it every year, but the best way to improve academic outcomes for your child is to make sure they continue to develop a love of reading over the holidays. If they can read daily, it gives them a distinct advantage over their peers in the long run. Bed time is a great time to curl up with a good book and a great habit to get into. We also know that students who do not read over the holidays will go backwards in terms of their academic progress, so it really pays to read, read!

### 4 Ways to Make Holidays Better for Kids

It's easy for children to be smitten with the magic of the holidays. Fun presents. Extra sweets. A vacation from school—there's a lot to like. But with the freedom and excess of the season, sometimes kids can get a <u>little carried away</u>. For most families, there will be a point when the kids get overtired and cranky, or greedy about presents, or would <u>rather play a video game</u> than talk to Grandma. Here are some tips to keep kids happy and ready to enjoy

whatever the season brings.

**1. Gifts, gifts:** Getting presents is a high point of the holidays for any kid, but they shouldn't be the only focus. As adults we know that giving presents can be just as rewarding as getting them, and we shouldn't wait to teach that lesson to our children.

Even when kids are too young to buy a present, they can still make one, or help you pick out something. Some of my best holiday memories are of helping my father look for the perfect gift for Mom, or combing the mall to look for presents with my siblings as we got older.

Volunteering, participating in a local toy drive, or giving each of your kids a little money to give to a charity of their choice are all great ideas for getting children in a more generous mood.

Also, remember that the <u>best gifts</u> that you give your children probably won't be the material ones. Taking time for the whole family to get together to play a game, watch a movie, or decorate sugar cookies—these are the things that kids remember as they get older.

- **2. Let them help out:** There's a lot of extra work to do around the holidays putting up decorations, cooking big dinners, throwing parties. The Martha Stewart in all of us can take over, but it's important to take a step back and make sure our kids are included, too.
- Children can help set the table, decorate the house, and wrap presents. If they're too young to wrap, they can help by holding down the paper or getting the tape ready there's always something kids can do. And at holiday time, the preparations are often as fun and as

meaningful as the end product. Plus, this way kids won't feel left out — or be glued to the iPad for hours.

**3. Keep routines:** We love the holidays because they give us a break from the everyday, but that can also make them stressful, especially for kids who find routine comforting. Try to keep some things constant. Kids still need snack time, they still need special attention from you, and they still need a chance to unwind before <u>bedtime</u>.

At <u>family gatherings</u> when they notice the kids are "getting antsy," psychologist Rachel Busman says she and her sister give them their baths, get them into pyjamas, and turn on a movie. "We know when they need to wind down, and no one judges us for excusing ourselves from the table to do these things," she says. "In fact, my sister and I enjoy some great conversations during this time."

**4. Remember they're kids:** Some holiday traditions depend on kids being on their best behaviour: <u>lengthy services, parties with lots of strangers, elaborate meals</u> that may not appeal to <u>picky eaters</u>. Try to keep those to a minimum and customize festivities for your kids' frustration level. Don't schedule more than one demanding event in a day, and make sure to include physical activity and plenty of downtime. Your kids will be grateful — and so will you.






