Message From The Principal

It feels like we've only just returned to school for 2023, but the end of term is looming large and we have already done so much. Most notably, can I start by saying how impressed I am with our preps and the ease with which they have settled into school. Yesterday and today I have been able to observe some of their "Prep Induction" ceremonies and the first thing that comes to mind is the bond they have already created with their buddies. This connection will serve them well, not only in 2023, but next year as their buddies become school leaders in Year 6.

It's not just the preps who have come a long way though. We are seeing a shift towards greater independence that has been lacking during the Covid years. Although I note there is still a bit of a way to go before we recapture our pre-Covid independence, more and more we are remembering just how independent our students can be as they take on new learning and new social skills. A large focus of our wellbeing program has been about helping students to identify the sorts of age appropriate behaviours we should be seeing in school, from Year 6's being able to make good choices under peer pressure to preps being able to carry their own bags. I'm sure as the year unfolds, this will only improve further.

Early Dismissal Thursday April 6th - 2:30pm

On the last day of term students will be dismissed at **2:30pm**. Students will be dismissed from their classrooms after a slightly earlier lunch break. If you are not able to collect your child at this time, please make arrangements via Camp Australia for Out of School Hours Care. It is not fair to our office staff to have a foyer full of students whose parents need to be contacted to remind them of the earlier finish. Unfortunately, this seems to be happening more and more frequently. The slightly earlier finish on the last day of term has been happening since I was in primary school, so you know it's been around for a while and is not a new thing! Again, please be aware of the 2:30pm finish time on Thursday April 6th.

Holiday Reading

As always, I strongly encourage all students to continue to read over the school holidays. I often refer to the statistic that 67 minutes of reading a day will help a child to achieve, on average, in the 98th percentile for their age. This means reading over the holidays as well. Perhaps it's 30 minutes before going to bed, or 15 minutes of downtime in the sunshine. It could be reading to a younger sibling or trying a new and more challenging book. The important thing is to be reading for enjoyment and building a strong vocabulary in the process.

I particularly hope that our senior students from Years 3-6 take the time to read independently over the holidays, as this is the time when we often start to see a plateau start to occur in student achievement. This is reflected across the country and the best way to set ourselves apart is to enjoy a good book. Parents, if I can ask for your help in encouraging your child/ren to find some time for

reading, I know it will lead to better life outcomes for all of our students.

On the last day of term, all parents and family members are invited to join us for the annual Easter Hat Parade and raffle draw. The parade will commence at 9:15am, with the raffle drawn at the conclusion of the parade.

EMOTIONAL NEEDS OF CHILDREN – Part 2

Be Available

When your children need you, make an effort to stop what you are doing and be available. Your time with your little ones is limited and shouldn't be spent in distracted mode. Make a special effort to not be on your phone during the time you spend together.

We often place the emphasis on taking care of a child's physical needs but being emotionally available for a child is just as important.

Make Time

Over and above being available when you are with your children, it's also important to make time during your busy schedule to spend time together.

Time is limited but it will always be split between the things you prioritize most. Other things may fall behind and not get done but time with your children is an investment and is a fleeting period you'll never get back if you don't make the most of it.

Supervise Play

Children up to the age of preschool need to be supervised by an adult during play. Even though older children are able to play cooperatively, they still need the presence of an adult nearby or they will feel unsettled. This helps them feel safe and secure to continue playing as they know there is someone to help if necessary.

Keep Your Promises

Children learn very quickly whether they can trust an adult or not. It is vital to always keep the promises you make to them.

A positive relationship between parent and child can only be formed on mutual trust. This also teaches them to form trusting relationships with others throughout their lives.

Encourage Sharing of Emotions

Teach your children to openly share their emotions. Have frequent discussions about how they are feeling or how they feel after a particular experience, such as a conflict with a friend or losing a pet.

Teach your children that boys and girls experience the same emotions and never discourage an emotion based on gender.

Introduce fun feelings activities that explore different emotions.

Allow Your Child to Experience All Emotions

It is also important that your children are allowed to experience the full array of emotions – good and bad. You may want to protect them from feeling upset or disappointed by sorting out their problems for them or intervening too often but this will not benefit them in the long run. When your children are independent they must be able to deal with their emotions and not let a small disappointment, such as not winning a race in school, become a crippling event.

Live well and laugh often! Enjoy the break.


