#### **Message From The Principal**

#### **Assistant Principal Appointment**

It is with great pleasure that I can announce that Nicola Weerakoon has been appointed as our substantive Assistant Principal. Nicola has acted in the role since November 2021, following the departure of Tom Boyle. After Mr. Boyle's recent confirmation of his appointment, we were then able to advertise the role and complete the formal merit process. Mrs Weerakoon was the standout candidate in a strong field. Her commitment to this school is exceptional and we are very fortunate to have her as part of the leadership team. I am sure that Mrs Weerakoon will continue to support our staff to provide the best possible outcomes for the students of MPS.

#### **Conferences & Individual Education Plans**

Last Tuesday students, parents and teachers met to discuss the progress made since the midyear reports and to work together to set each student's goals for the remainder of the year. As I made my way around the school, there were plenty of good conversations being had where it was noticeable that the student knew exactly what they needed to do to meet their own point of need. Teachers are now busily editing the draft documents ready for families. We hope that you will continue to engage with your children and support them to achieve their goals. By developing a strong home-school partnership, we can ensure that every student achieves their best. For most families, goals will include a literacy and numeracy section and a student voice goal. As students move through the year levels, those student goals can become more focused on other areas of the curriculum such as STEM or the Arts. Goals are developed based on ongoing assessment, student input and of course, parent feedback at the conferences. We hope that through this targeted approach, you will see where your child's strengths are and where they need to focus their energies to ensure future success.

#### Parking & U-turns

We have observed parking inspectors around the school this week and they have had a particular eye on the kiss and go drop off zone. I would remind families that the zone is for 5 minute parking prior to school and at pick up. Getting here





early and parking for 30 minutes in the zone will likely result in a fine, as will leaving your car. Parents must stay with their vehicle to avoid a fine. Getting out of the car to help with bags and car seats is fine, but walking away from your vehicle is a risk. This is clearly signposted. The school continues to work with the council and government to address parking around the school, with a new car park proposed behind the stadium via Maygrove Way and the tennis club entrance to the reserve. In the meantime, there is plenty of parking on the eastern side of Gladeswood Reserve and I would strongly encourage families to utilise this option. Whilst I'm on the topic of driving, I would again remind parents that U-turns are illegal in front of the school. For the safety of all of our students, can I please ask families to stop this practice? It hinders the view of the crossing supervisor and does not account for students who may be crossing the road behind the starting direction of your vehicle.

\*\*A reminder that the staff carpark is not a drop off or pick up zone. It is strictly for staff only and families should not be walking through the car park before or after school.

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#### **Smart Watches**

As per the Department of Education and the school's policy, if a Smart Watch is worn to school it must be placed in "flight mode" so as to disable the text and call features. Recently we have had examples of students actively conversing with people outside of the school during class time. Clearly we expect that students are focused on the task at hand, rather than texts from external sources. If a family member needs to make contact, we would ask that this is done via the school office. Having an active watch is a distraction that is easily avoided by the press of a button. Please ensure that your child is respecting the school rules by using flight mode when at school. As has been the case for many years, students are required to hand their phones into the classroom teacher at the start of the school day. Phones should be switched off and only turned on after school.

#### **Artificial Intelligence**

Late last week I attended the Victorian Principals Association Conference. The event covered a wide range of topics, but I was certainly engaged by the presentation on Artificial Intelligence (AI) and how it can be applied in a school setting. I am not alone in thinking that this can be a slippery slope for schools, particularly when it comes to privacy and creativity. During the presentation, I witnessed students in another country wearing headbands that measured their levels of concentration and relayed that information back to the teacher. That information was then shared with the parents of the class in a league table. Fortunately, I cannot see a time when we would implement such a policy in Australia, but it does highlight that AI is here and we need to be mindful of the opportunities, as well as the dangers.

For me, creativity is an essential part of life. Future innovation relies on people having the capacity to create. We want students to explore the world around them and we want to encourage them to think for themselves. This should come before any introduction of AI. Following that, we will undoubtedly see new technologies emerge where students devise plans to harness the power of AI. It is something the school will explore with caution and in time, I hope that we can enhance the learning experience through the positive use of AI.

#### **Tummy Time**

Earlier this week I enjoyed a visit into one of the Prep classes and was observing an excellent reading lesson on the features of a non-fiction text. One of the follow up tasks required the students to draw some of the animals from the text. I paid particular attention to the pencil grips of the students and the variety is always noticeable.



With this in mind, I was prompted to think about the routines that help pre-prep and early years students to develop their drawing ability, which supports their writing later on. The importance of "tummy time" cannot be underestimated. Occupational therapists recommend that children spend time on their tummies drawing and writing. This builds the musculature of the neck and upper arms and helps build stamina. Activities that are suited for tummy time include writing, drawing, tracing and even playing games.

Another aid that helps students is a pencil grip. These small rubber devices slide over the pencil and promote the correct grip. Education supply stores and bookstores often have these available, or you can buy them online. Having one on a pencil to get students used to the correct grip before school is a great way to fast track their writing, as it will help them form letters sooner. Combined, tummy time drawing circles and lines will help a child progress. Whether a child is not yet at school, or in Year 2 and going well, I recommend putting the electronic devices away and encouraging children to draw as often as possible.

#### Parent Requests for 2023 (from previous newsletter)

It's that time of the year again when we seek parent requests for 2023 grade placements. Firstly a reminder that requests must be based on educational grounds and the school cannot guarantee every request due to the complexity of the process, however every effort will be made to cater to the needs of each individual student. Attached to this newsletter is the 2023 request form. The forms are due by 4pm on Monday September 11th and can be emailed to me directly via Charles.spicer@education.vic.gov.au. I would remind parents that requests for individual teachers are not practical and that no late requests can be accepted. Parents will be advised of the 2023 classes in early December, in time for our students to commence their end of year transition process. Again, I would remind families that we set up these classes with a view to trialling them over the last three weeks of the school year to reduce any anxiety over the holidays. This has been extremely effective over the last few years due to the great work of the teachers in getting the balance right. Please note that the school will put the needs of students first at all times and that whilst we endeavour to meet all requests, on occasion, some requests may not be possible.

## THE GIFT OF CHORES

The topic of family contributions (aka chores) has been a consistent part of the Love and Logic approach for decades.

There are many reasons that we focus on family contributions. They provide an opportunity for kids to learn important life lessons about responsibility, perseverance, humility, and the fact that good feelings come when we serve others. Contributions to the family help kids develop a sense of accomplishment and success, and we believe that they are the foundation for developing a strong sense of responsibility and healthy self-esteem.

Getting started with modelling these tasks will help your kids throughout the year - and throughout their lives. Here are some steps for modelling family contributions:

- Make sure that your kids see you doing them and that you are working hard and even struggling to get them done.
- Make sure that they see you feel a sense of completion and accomplishment as well as how good you feel after they're are done.
- Think out loud while you are working. Say things like, "This is hard, but I've got to do it, so I'm going to do it right now." After it's done, you can say, "It's done! I feel great now that it's done."

It's very important that your kids realize that you sometimes must work hard at something you don't necessarily like. Covering up your struggle or saying that chores are fun, when they're not, creates frustration and resentment within kids when they must struggle with their own chores. Be positive about doing your chores—but be honest about your struggles.


