Message From The Principal

The school year is rapidly drawing to a close, but we are not done yet! The swimming program commences next week, as does our whole school transition program, with students meeting their new teachers next Thursday, November 30th, but more on that later. We also have our students practising their carols, our Year 6's are gearing up for Graduation and through all of this, our regular clubs and programs will continue to run as we teach right through to the very last day. Whilst the remaining month will be incredibly busy, I would remind all students to continue to maintain their daily home reading and to carry this through the summer holidays. 15-30 minutes of reading each evening makes an enormous difference to long term student outcomes and if we can establish reading for enjoyment as an automatic routine, we are setting our children up for success.

2024 Transition P-6

We have now completed our four Prep transition sessions and we have had a fantastic time with our new students. The 2024 Prep students have been visiting the different Prep teachers and sharing their classroom experiences with new students each week. Next week, on **Wednesday November 29**th commencing at **6:30pm**, we will be conducting our Prep Parent Information Evening in the stadium. Families will be provided with an overview of the year ahead and how they can best prepare for the beginning of the school year. Our prep families will also learn their 2024 grades and who their teachers will be for the next year. Following this on **Tuesday December 12**th, our 2024 preps will come together for a final transition session in their new grades from **9:15-10:15am**.

On Thursday November 30th, we will begin our transition program with the remainder of our students meeting their class teachers and classmates for the first of three sessions over the coming weeks. The sessions are designed to allow students time to get to know their new class and surroundings before the end of the school year. It has been our experience that this reduces anxiety and makes for a much easier return to school in January. In order for the early release of class information to be successful however, we would ask that you give the new class a chance to settle in, as per previous years. Teachers have gone to great lengths to balance the classes from an academic, social and behavioural point of view. The grades take into account student friendship requests and known clashes, in order to give every child a great start to the next school year. I would also make note of the fact that primary school is a time for students to learn how to make friends. Very rarely do we, as adults, remain friends with all of our primary school friends. This is in part due to the changing developmental stages that primary aged children go through and the refining of their own values. Often, what we see in a friend in prep may be something we are no longer

looking for when we are in grade 4. The ability to make new friends is an essential part of growing up, so we do hope that families can allow their children the opportunity to make some more when they meet their new class.

Graduation is always a wonderful event full of pride and emotion, so I look forward to sharing the evening with our senior students and their families. Professional Practice Planning Day - Thursday 14th December - Students Not Required to Attend School

As part of the Victorian Government Schools Agreement (VGSA), this year, teachers are entitled to two days per year release from their scheduled duties for a Professional Practice Day.

In previous years, Professional Practice Days (4 per year) have been taken by staff in small groups or individually and teachers were replaced, as there was staff available to replace them. With such a shortage of replacement teachers, the Department of Education has recommended for schools to have staff take their Professional Practice Day on the same day and that students are not required to attend on that day.

As such, students will not be required to attend school on **Thursday 14th December**. The work undertaken by staff on these days is consistent with Departmental and school priorities and provides an excellent opportunity for staff to reflect on student data, collaboratively plan next year's curriculum and ensure that the best learning opportunities are provided for your children. This day has been communicated previously and is approved by the School Council.

Assembly Update & Final School Day for 2023

We have two assemblies remaining this year. Next week there will not be an assembly due to the swimming program, so our last regular assembly will be held on Friday December 15th commencing at 2:40pm. At this time we will be announcing our Year 6 student leaders for 2024, so it is always an exciting assembly. We will also hold a small farewell assembly on the last day of the school year for our departing Year 6 students on **Wednesday December 20th**, **commencing at 1pm**. The Year 6 students will be dismissed from the stadium, whilst all other students will be dismissed from their classrooms at 1:30pm.

Why do kids grizzle and whine?

Because it works! Like chicks in a nest that pester and peck until their parent regurgitates worm bits down their throats, kids have learned that whining gets them what they want. Do you want to spend the rest of your parenting years trapped with grizzly, whiney kids? No? Then promise yourself, "I am never going to give in to a request made to me in a whiney voice. Or a cranky, bullying one either."

When they come at you with, "Mum! Mum! Mum! Muu! *Muuuuum*!" say, "Sorry, I'm not listening to that. If you want my answer now, it's no. Pop away, practise your nice polite voice and come back and ask me again." I doubt it will work straight away – they might just notch up the volume and unpleasantness. But stand your ground and repeat the 'nice polite voice' instruction.

And you know what? They will – they will come back and ask you in a nice polite voice. Then you can say, "*No!*" I'm kidding – you don't have to be cruel. Listen to them. When they discover that well-mannered requests work well for them and whining never works, you will start to see a shift in tone at you place.

If you whine and grizzle back at them, guess what they will learn? Drag up the acting skills you use for job interviews and visiting relatives, switch on a soft lilting voice without a hint of edge or threat, and say, "When you can speak to me as softly and politely as I'm talking to you, I will listen."


