We are most fortunate to have a number of parents and friends who assist the school in so many ways. Without this help our school would not function at the high level it does. We hope to see you there so that we can once again express our gratitude for your assistance.

Swimming

This week sees the conclusion of our swimming program. The students have enjoyed and benefitted from the high level instruction and opportunity to further develop their swimming and water safety skills. While it's a chaotic two weeks and students will no doubt be feeling a little tired, I am immensely proud of the way our students have conducted themselves and the positive feedback received from the instructors.

Carols

Classes have been busily practising their songs for the night and we look forward to a wonderful evening! Our Christmas Carols Concert will take place on **Wednesday**, **13th December**. The night will kick off at 5:00pm with a sausage sizzle and other treats available from the canteen. The concert will be held in the courtyard and commence at 5:30pm. All year levels will sing a Christmas carol, with special performances by the school choir. All families are invited to bring blankets and chairs, however, we ask that those bringing a deck chair to please set up behind the designated "blanket zone". We look forward to a wonderful evening where our families can enjoy each other's company and some festive cheer.

Uniforms

All students are required to attend school in proper MPS uniform and whilst the end of the year often sees families "stretching the life out of items" or using nonuniform clothing, we would remind families that full uniform is required for the start of the new school year. Whilst it may seem trivial, signing up to attend MPS includes agreeing to uphold our uniform standards. As we move into 2024 the only uniform that is acceptable to wear each day is listed on the PSW website, with the exception of shoes where we recognise the importance of choosing the appropriate active footwear for your child's growing feet. Having a consistent uniform is a mark of respect and also an important aspect of student discipline and behavioural standards. It also becomes an important visual aid for when we leave the school grounds and are representing the school in the broader community. In the end, it says I attend Mulgrave Primary School and builds pride in our school community.

Final Assemblies

This year we will run two end of year assemblies. The first will be held on **Friday December 15th** when our student leaders for 2024 will be presented with their badges. This assembly will commence at 2.40pm. On **Wednesday December the 20th** (the last day of school), we will farewell the graduating class of 2023. We will commence at 1:00pm, with Year 6 students dismissed at the end of assembly. Prep to Year 5 students will return to their classrooms to collect their bags and will be dismissed at 1:30pm. Please be advised that as per usual, students must be collected by parents and guardians within 15 mins of the bell signalling the end of the day. Teachers will be on Yard Duty until 1.45pm. Children move through developmental stages where their brains become better equipped to interpret themes in the broader world. The Australian rating system is based on these milestones and are a good guide for what your children should be exposed to. With the holidays approaching and screen time on the rise, your cooperation in ensuring your child is viewing age appropriate content is appreciated.

Reading

I know it's said every year, but the best way to improve academic outcomes for your child is to make sure they continue to develop a love of reading over the holidays. If they can read daily, it gives them a distinct advantage over their peers in the long run. Bed time is a great time to curl up with a good book and a great habit to get into. We also know that students who do not read over the holidays will go backwards in terms of their academic progress, so it really pays to read, read!

10 TIPS FOR SURVIVING SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

1. Plan

- Get your kids involved in making a list of activities that they would like to do
- Plan for good and bad weather
- Schedule downtime and time-out as well as time for one-on-one and family group activities

2. The best things in life are free

• Make sure the list includes plenty of free activities such as picnics, bike rides, trips to the beach, the local library and the great outdoors

3. Boredom is good

• Unstructured time and time away from electronic devices is good for young minds

4. Use opportunities to teach new skills and self-reliance

• Not having the pressure to rush out the door in the morning can allow for kids to develop new skills such as getting their own breakfast and lunch, taking the dog for a walk or going to the shops by themselves.

5. Ask for help

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

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
