# **Message From The Principal**

For your reference, I have included some additional answers to frequently asked questions below.

## **Curriculum Contributions**

### **Parking**

A reminder that the areas in front of the school on Gladeswood Drive are 5 minute Kiss and Go parking. Parents are required to stay with their cars at all times or risk a fine in the mail. The school is currently working to deliver a new car park at the rear of the school that will alleviate some of the congestion. As of late last year, state government funding has been approved, but the carpark will not be ready until late 2025. In the meantime, I encourage parents to make the most of the car park on the other side of Gladeswood Reserve. There are plenty of spaces and it reduces congestion around the front of the school.

Even though the school year is still young, I cannot help but notice the amount of times parents ignore the signage at the front of the school, particularly parking in no-standing areas close to the crossing. The signs are there to ensure the safety of the students in our care and it's not good enough to simply ignore them by thinking you'll only be stopped for a minute. It obscures the sight lines of the crossing supervisor and puts other children at risk. This behaviour sets an incredibly poor example to our students by saying that the rules don't apply to their parents. We all have a role to play, by following the speed limit, not doing U-turns across the unbroken line and following the parking signs.

The school has no control over parking fines, but we do know that council officers patrol from time to time in unmarked cars. The first you'll know about it is the fine in the mail.

An early heads-up that school photos will be taken on **Wednesday March 13**th. Hopefully this allows enough time to ensure that those school uniforms are looking their best on the day. If families are in need of a new uniform, they can be purchased via PSW either online or in-store at their Glen Waverley outlet.

# INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

# CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
