### **Message From The Principal**

### Prep Family Welcome BBQ

A reminder that following school on Friday, we will be holding the prep family BBQ from 4-5:30pm. This is a great opportunity to meet new families and chat with some of the staff and school councillors.

### **Assembly and Curriculum Day**

Next week we will be running our whole school assembly **on Thursday March 7<sup>th</sup>**, as **Friday March 8<sup>th</sup>** is a student free day as staff gather to refresh their literacy skills with a particular focus on the teaching of



reading. We will be presenting our **Student Voice Team** badges on the day as well as our Specialist awards for February. In regard to the curriculum day, Camp Australia will be providing an all day program should families need the support.

### 2025 Enrolments

Changes are coming to the enrolment process for 2025. Under the new system, families will be directed to a new online portal where they can fill out an application for enrolment digitally, and submit documents such as birth and immunisation certificates. The new process is being rolled out by the state government in the Inner and Outer East and parts of Southern Region. Mulgrave sits on the border

of these three areas, so all families will be expected to use the new system.

More information will be sent home in the coming weeks, with the system due to go live early in Term 2.

In the meantime school tours will be delivered on a fortnightly basis, alternating from Tuesdays and Thursdays. New families are encouraged to book in for a school tour to find out more about our school and our programs. At MPS, we are currently at full capacity and therefore must follow the enrolment restrictions provided by the department. This means that we can only take a maximum of 66 students in Foundation in 2025. In addition, we must follow the priority order of placement, which is:

- 1. Students residing inside the school's zone
- 2. Siblings of students currently enrolled
- 3. Students from outside of the school's zone

We expect to be able to provide support for families in term two when the system goes live, but in the meantime, if you know that you have a child starting in 2025, please contact Viki Ali at the office so that she can gather some basic details.

### **Lost Opportunities**

Lateness and lost opportunities are a big focus for the Department of Education and our school this year, the accumulated absence or lateness does add up to significant lost learning time. Consider this:

- A student who is late by half an hour each day misses the equivalent of 16.6 days of learning each year.
- An 80% attendance rate is the equivalent of missing one day per week or 40 days of lost learning for the school year which could add up to 2 ½ years from Prep Year 12.
- 85% attendance equals 30 days of lost learning per year or 2 years from Prep Year 12.
- 90% attendance equals 1 day per fortnight or 20 days per year equalling one year of absence from Prep Year 12.
- 95% attendance equals 10 days of lost learning and over half a year of lost opportunities from Prep Year 12.

Research that the Department of Education is leaning on indicates that there is no safe threshold to missing school. They determined this using a combination of school enrolment figures, attendance records and NAPLAN results provided by the WA Education Department. They studied patterns of over 415,000 primary and high school students over a five-year time frame. In all analyses, average academic achievement on NAPLAN tests declined with any absence from school and continued to decline as absence rates increased.

Every day of absence made a difference, and this was particularly true for unauthorised absences. The effect of one day of absence was relatively small but added up quickly as more and more days were missed. The effect of missing days accumulated over time, so that school absence not only impacted achievement in the year in which the days were missed but in future years as well. The message is straightforward and well supported, every day of school that is missed is a lost opportunity, please ensure your child is at school every day!

Following on from this, we are unfortunately seeing far too many students arriving at school late. This is a constant disruption to the classroom program and to the school office. I know that we have raised this issue many times in the newsletter and last year it got to the point where students who were late repeatedly were being asked to make up the lost time during recess or lunch. I do not want to go down that path again, so can I please ask all families to **aim to be at school by no later than 8:57am**, which is when the music begins. This allows all students time to be in their classroom by 9am, ready for instruction.

### **Opening Hours**

I would like to remind families that the school operates between 8:45am and 3:45pm. We request that families do not enter the school grounds prior or after these times, unless it is to attend before or after school care or for special events. Previously, we had surveyed families around this very topic and the overwhelming response was supportive of this arrangement.

Teachers are not on yard duty until 8:45am and finish yard duty at 3:45pm so that they can complete other tasks before and after these times. As such, we cannot guarantee the safety of students who are entering the school grounds outside of these times. We would hate to see an injury occur because a child was left unsupervised. If your child needs to arrive prior to or after these times, please enrol them with Camp Australia.

### **Staff Carpark**

There has been a significant increase in foot traffic through the staff carpark, both before and after school. Please be aware that this area is out of bounds and we would ask families to use the pedestrian gates on their way in and out of school. There is absolutely no reason for families to be walking through the car park between 8:45 and 9:15am and 3:15 and 3:45pm. Families can enter the car park outside of these times if they are dropping off and picking up their children from Out of School Care.



### **Road Safety**

Whilst on road safety I would like make it clear that there are several signs in front of the school that clearly demonstrate that U-turns are illegal in front of the school. Unfortunately, we see this ignored daily and it is extremely disappointing that we can't set a good example and consider the safety of all children at peak times.

In addition, we are regularly seeing cars double parked and letting students out whilst traffic banks up behind them. Double parking is very dangerous, as children are moving between cars that may be about to reverse or drive off. We ask that parents drive on to Gladeswood Reserve if there is congestion.

With this in mind, I would also note that there have been a significant number of times where students are clearly not wearing seatbelts as a car moves off. We encourage all families to park sensibly and find the time to ensure all children are safe before driving.

Finally, the Kiss and Go zones in front of the school have clear restrictions. Drivers cannot leave their vehicles to enter the school grounds. If you wish to leave your car parked and enter, please park elsewhere. The Kiss and Go zones are 5 minute spaces and are designed to relieve congestion, but this falls over if one car is left unattended, as it stops the flow of vehicles. You can be fined for leaving your car unattended, so I strongly recommend that you stay with your vehicle at all times, only exiting the car to help with seat belts and school bags.

#### **CCTV**

I want to inform our community, as a courtesy, that we have CCTV cameras all around Mulgrave PS. The purpose of these cameras is to provide security for our school campus out of school hours. CCTV is a very effective deterrent and helps us to ensure we are not subject to vandalism. The footage is kept for a period of approximately three weeks and is only accessed if there is an issue.



### **Teacher-Family Communication**

The school would like to encourage and promote positive and valuable partnerships between home and school. As per previous years, the following protocols provide an outline for effective communication between teachers and parents. In addition, please find a list of the email addresses of our teaching teams below, although it should be noted that the preferred mode of contacting your child's teacher is via Seesaw:



- Please allow 48 hours for an email response to be provided
- Urgent messages are still to be sent to the office
- During the day, teachers are teaching, there is limited availability to respond to emails between 8:45am 4pm.
- We encourage face to face communication to resolve complex matters
- Responses will not be provided over the weekend
- Please be respectful and polite in communication with staff
- Absences are still to be communicated to the office
- The nature of flexible working hours means that you may be sending an email at a time of convenience for you, please note, our staff will reply at a time that is convenient and available for them.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$150 for primary school students
- . \$250 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.




