New Library, Art & STEM Centre

Following a presentation to school council last Tuesday night by our Principal Design Consultants Tectura, council has endorsed the plans for the new building. The new structure will replace the existing Block A, otherwise known as the old hall and art room. In the coming months, Tectura will guide the school through the tender process where a builder will be selected to bring this facility to life. Later in the year construction will commence and should take approximately 15-18 months to complete.

Once finished, MPS will have a new library that will be accessible from the courtyard, along with new and improved art and STEM facilities. This project will provide us with a purpose built STEM classroom, complete with a presentation room and green screen room that will support our technology programs. In addition, a new car park will be constructed with access from Maygrove Way via the reserve.

Parent Contributions

A reminder that contributions for the 2024 school year can be made via the office. The school receives limited funding for the day to day running of the school and parent contributions go a long way to supporting us to provide the additional programs and resources that we do. In particular, the school is trying to roll out one to one devices from Year 3 and up. This is only a small percentage of the parent contributions and it is a significant saving on a parent paid 1:1 device scheme, as it is subsidised by the school. We need parent support to achieve this and to cover things such as arts, STEM, PE and Spanish supplies. In addition, the base allowance for students doesn't include the book pack, which is another significant cost that the school incurs, but we refuse to provide nothing more than a pencil and a piece of paper as required. Whilst contributions are voluntary we appreciate every contribution made and remind parents that instalment plans are available to break up the cost, which is less than \$10 per week.

Ramadan – March 11th to April 9th

Ramadan is observed by Muslims worldwide as a month of fasting, prayer, reflection, and community. It is a time for spiritual purification and gratitude. Throughout Ramadan, Muslims are encouraged to do good deeds and abstain from sinful acts. Ramadan concludes with the celebration of Eid al-Fitr, which culminates in a celebratory feast as families gather to mark the end of fasting. Over the remainder of the school term, many of our families will be observing Ramadan and the school is mindful of the challenges that young children can face throughout this time. Please advise your child's teacher if your child requires additional support.

The school is in the middle of the NAPLAN testing window. A reminder to Year 3 and 5 families that all students need to be at school on time, to ensure that testing can get underway without any issues. Being punctual is a mark of respect towards your classmates during this busy time. I would also remind families that a good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast before a test is essential to good outcomes. Being well rested and full of energy allows the brain to function at its best!

Traffic Safety



A reminder that the Gladeswood Drive 'Kiss and Go' parking zone requires parents to stay with their cars at all times. We cannot help but notice the amount of times parents ignore the signage around the school, particularly stopping in no-standing areas near driveways and the level-crossing. The signs are there to ensure the safety of the students in our care and it's not good enough to simply ignore them by thinking you'll only be stopped for a minute. It obscures the sight lines of pedestrians and drivers alike and puts members of the community at risk. Further, by leaving your car parked in the Kiss and Go area, it impedes the flow of traffic and impacts on other families that are trying to use the parking zone. If you do need to leave your car, even for a minute, please park in the designated areas around the school and Gladeswood Reserve.

Please note: the school has no control over parking fines, but we do know that council officers patrol from time to time with camera in hand.
