#### **Message From The Principal**

Another busy fortnight is coming to an end, with students across the school working hard in the classroom and currently enjoying our tennis clinics. Now that we are approaching the halfway point of the term, we hope that your child has settled into their routines and that they are all reading daily as part of their homework tasks.

#### Welcome Greg Paine

MPS is lucky to have Mr. Greg Paine working with us for Term 1. Mr. Paine is a former principal and mentor of mine. He has spent several years abroad and whilst he is back for a short term visit, we have been lucky enough to arrange for him to provide a range of supports across the school. Mr. Paine is primarily working as a leadership coach for our middle leaders, but he is also providing support to all teaching staff and particularly the preps as they settle into their new routines. We welcome Mr. Paine to the team for Term 1 and we will no doubt benefit from his extensive knowledge and system wide leadership.

#### NAPLAN - 12th-24th March

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) involves students in Years 3 and 5 from all states and territories in Australia. NAPLAN testing will take place from Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> March, through to Monday 24<sup>th</sup> March. Students' skills in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and numeracy will be assessed. These national test results provide information on how your child is progressing and performing in the key areas of literacy and numeracy and also help to support improvements in teaching to benefit your child. Parents can support their children to be ready to participate in these assessment tasks by facilitating a smooth, calm start to each day. Please ensure that your child/ren have breakfast before coming to school and that they arrive to school on time.

Individual student NAPLAN reports will be forwarded to families later in the year. These reports will provide parents and staff with a snapshot of students' achievements but should not be seen as a definitive or comprehensive assessment. Thanks to Ms Emma Harrison for her organisation and coordination of the NAPLAN assessment and thank you to all staff involved in supervising.

#### **Building Site Fencing**

#### **Space Elaine**

Former Mulgrave Primary student Elaine Chia Hyde became the first Australian in woman in space this week as part of a six-person crew aboard the Blue Origin rocket. Elaine spent her prep year at MPS and has acknowledged the positive impact her time here had on her life. We are hopeful of setting up a Zoom session with Elaine so that some of our students can meet her and listen to her incredible story, not just in terms of her low earth orbit, but her success as a business leader around the world. If only our new STEM centre and presentation space was already up and running, but perhaps Elaine's chat with our students will inspire them to pursue the STEM fields later in life.

#### **Front Garden**

My thanks to the Lawson family for planting out the area in front of the office. The Lawson's have generously given a significant amount of their time to assist with the tidying and replanting of existing garden beds around the school. I look forward to watching the new plants mature over time and I would ask all families to be mindful on the new plantings as they move around the office area.

#### Lateness

Unfortunately, we are seeing far too many students arriving late. On a daily basis we are seeing 20 or more students arriving after 8:57am. This leads to a significant disruption across virtually every classroom. The morning learning block is the most important of the day, as research tells us that children learn best in those first 2 hours. Having every class interrupted daily means that we cannot maximise learning outcomes when teachers are required to stop the class to redirect a late arrival. Please, we ask all families to ensure that students are at school by 8:57am when the music starts. This way they are ready for line up, the grade can enter the classroom on time and learning can begin immediately.

#### **Student Attendance - Every Day Counts**

'We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school. There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes. Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are steps you can take to ensure they don't fall behind:

- Speak with your classroom teacher or year level coordinator and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.
- Develop an absence learning plan with your school and ensure your child completes the plan. Remember, everyday counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher or year level coordinator as early as possible.'

#### Kiss and Go Parking

The Kiss and Go parking zone is for short term use only. Parents and carers are not to leave their vehicle unattended at any time or they can incur a fine. Leaving a vehicle unattended also leads to the Kiss and Go parking zone becoming congested, reducing its effectiveness and negatively impacting other families trying to drop their children off at school. Please, **do not leave your car unattended and please keep to the 5 minute time limit**.

#### Curriculum Day March 7th

A reminder that the school will be running a **curriculum day on Friday March 7**th to prepare for our 4 yearly review in May. This is a student free day and we ask that families make alternative arrangements on the day. Camp Australia is unable to provide care, as demand has been low.

#### Labour Day Public Holiday March 10th

Following the curriculum day is the Labour Day public holiday on Monday March 10th. The school will be closed on this day.

#### School Photos April 3rd

As mentioned recently, the new date for school photos will be **Thursday April 3**<sup>rd</sup>. We would ask that all students attend in full school uniform on the day.




Our first Super Talent for the year, playing at assembly last Friday was Elsa T.

#### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

#### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$154 for primary school students
- · \$256 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure
